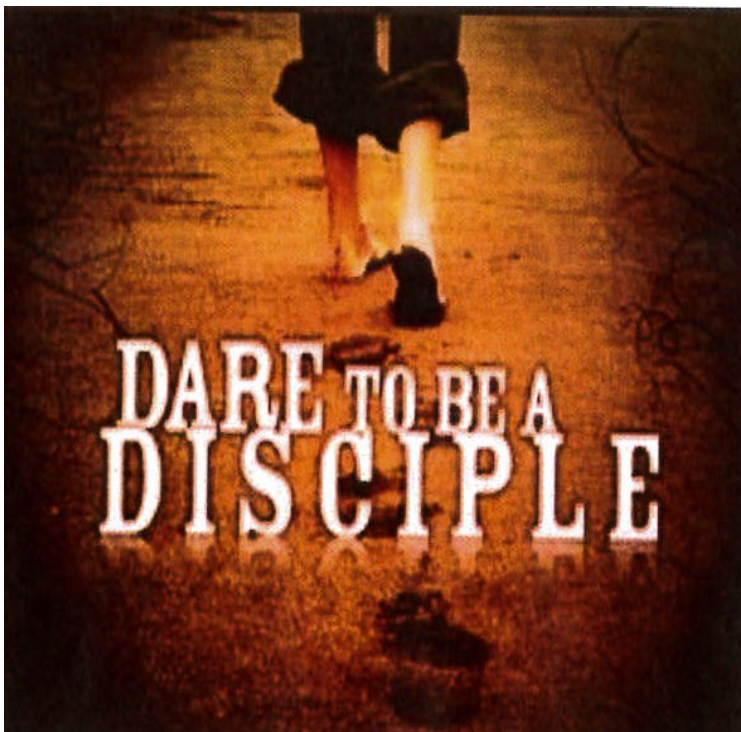

Word, Sacrament and Attending Other Churches

Normally, this Gospel is referenced as one of the key differences between Catholics and our Protestant siblings. This chapter from John's Gospel is a large part of why we believe that Jesus literally gives us his Body and Blood, transforming us more into himself every time we partake of Eucharist. "I am the bread of life." John 6:35

While in no way denigrating the amazingly precious, awesome gift of Eucharist, we nonetheless need to keep another important tidbit in mind. Our faith is based on Word and Sacrament. And not just Eucharist, but all seven Sacraments. Too often we denigrate the Bible, the Word of God, as something lesser than Eucharist.

This is an error on our part.

We can remember this when our loved ones (or we ourselves!) attend a nondenominational or other Protestant church service. Jesus is the bread of life who feeds us in Sacrament. But Jesus is the bread of life who also feeds us through his word.

If you have Catholic friends or family attending non-Catholic churches, respond to them in loving openness. Be Christ for them - be Eucharist for them. You can even consider breaking open the Word together. Share some of your favorite stories about Jesus!
