**Living Catholic in the 808:
Offering God Our Lives Part II**

One important reason we come to Mass is so we can work, so we can do the work of offering God our lives

Consider a portion of this classic daily offering prayer, "I offer You everything I do this day: my work, my prayers, my apostolic efforts; my time with family and friends; my hours of relaxation; my difficulties, problems, distress, which I shall try to bear with patience."

During the Offertory at Mass, we build on this daily prayer. We give our lives to God to do with as God wishes. We put our lives "on the altar." We place before God our very selves alongside everyone else present.

And what does God do with this offering with our sacrifice? Along with the bread and wine, God makes it sacred and gives it back to us. Four words capture the Eucharist - Take, Bless, Break, Give - are done not only with bread and wine but with our disciples. God **takes** our lives, as messy as they are, **blesses** them, **breaks** us (yes, this too!) and then **gives** us a better version of ourselves to be shared with one another.

This is one important reason why we come to Mass.

Christian Prevention and Relationship Enhancement Program 2016

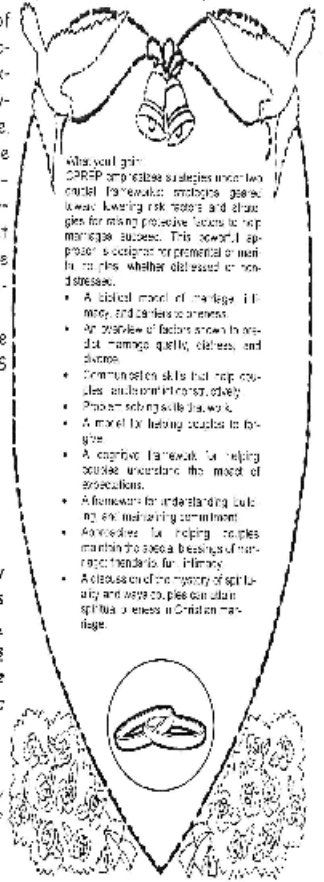
Based on research at the University of Denver started in 1960, the CPREP Approach is a program designed by experts to help couples build lasting, loving relationships and prevent divorce. The clinically tested techniques are for any couple—from the newly engaged to the long-time partners—who want to solve problems or prevent them from happening. It's for people who want to improve their marital communications.

The 6-classes/12 hour program will be held on the following SATURDAYS from 2 to 4 pm

- Feb/Mar/April:

- June/July:
June 4, 11, 18, 25 July 2, 9
- Oct/Nov:
Oct 1, 8, 15, 22, 29, Nov 5

All sessions are held at Our Lady Good Counsel Parish Center. Cost is \$20 for the Manual and material. Participants need to attend 6 classes for completion of the program. We welcome anyone from other Catholic & Christian churches.

Who you'll gain:

- CPREP empowers strategies from two model frameworks: marriage goals, lower risk factors and strategies for making positive decisions to help marriage succeed. This powerful approach's design is minimal or non-existent, whether distressed or non-distressed.
- A biblical model of marriage intimacy and decision-making.
- An overview of factors known to predict marriage quality, distress, and divorce.
- Communication skills that help couples understand each other's needs.
- Problem-solving skills that work.
- A model for helping couples to forgive.
- A cognitive framework for helping couples understand the model of expectations.
- A framework for understanding building and maintaining commitment.
- Activities for helping couples maintain the sacred blessings of marriage: tenderness, intimacy.
- A discussion of the mystery of spirituality and how couples can attain spiritual wellness in Christian marriage.
