The Man Born Blind and RCIA's Second Scrutiny

By coming into communion with the Catholic Church (aka, "becoming Catholic"), our RCIA candidates and catechumens are fully committing to Jesus Christ and to the People of God who make up the Body of Christ. No matter how long we have been followers of Jesus, each of us must still struggle to understand some things better. Like suffering. How can an all-knowing, all-loving God allow such pain, such suffering in the world?

Today's Gospel of the man born blind takes on this issue. Jesus' basic answer is that God does not cause suffering, but will use it where it exists to help us grow closer to God's very self.

More shockingly, Jesus, who IS God, never promises an end to suffering on earth. Unlike any product/service and advertised on TV, Jesus does not promise a rosy, happy life if we "buy in." We will still suffer. Still lose loved ones. Still get ill. Still die.

Jesus, however, also shows us how to approach and experience suffering. Jesus teaches us to embrace genuine suffering, to allow it to transform us and those around us. Like Jesus, we can transform suffering into openness and love, even into new life.

Pro-Life Reflection

Love your neighbor as yourself. I am the Lord.

~Lev 19:18

Reflection: The command "Love your neighbor" does not have distinctions, limitations, or exclusions. It includes our unborn neighbors.

And to love them "as yourself" does not simply mean to love them "to the degree" that you love yourself; it means first to recognize them as a person like yourself.

Prayer: Let Your command of love, O Lord, free us all from the prejudices that distract us. Open our eyes to see every human person as our neighbor and to act accordingly.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY SERIES I

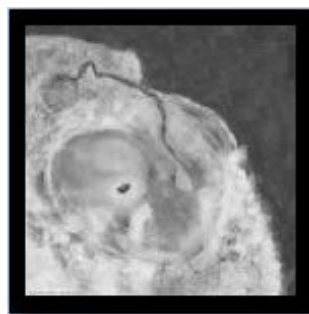
The Perpetual Adorers of the Blessed Sacrament (PABS) Ministry will have approximately five series of Jesus Divine Mercy in our Sunday Bulletin.

What is Divine Mercy all about?

In the 1930's, Jesus appeared to St. Faustina Kowalski and requested that a "Feast of Mercy" be officially established in the Church. "I desire that it be celebrated with great solemnity on the first Sunday after Easter... I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. The very depths of My tender mercy are open on that day. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon souls who will approach the fount of My Mercy" (I, 175, II, 138).

Pope John Paul II canonized St. Faustina on April 30, 2000 and established Divine Mercy Sunday as a feast day for the entire church. Pope John Paul II said, "It is important that we accept the whole message that comes to us from the word of God on this Second Sunday of Easter, which from now on throughout the Church, will be called, "Divine Mercy Sunday."

On April 23, 2006, Bishop Larry Silva dedicated the Diocese of Honolulu to The Divine Mercy. This year, Divine Mercy Sunday falls on April 27, 2014.

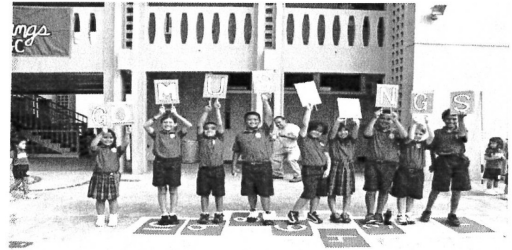
