Divine Mercy Sunday Series IV

"PREPARE OURSELVES FOR THE DAY OF GREAT MERCY"

Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, the Divine Mercy Sunday. It is a day chosen by Jesus Christ as a day of extraordinary graces. We have the privilege to prepare ourselves to receive the outpouring mercy of Jesus.

Here are the ways we can prepare:

Celebrate the Feast on the Sunday after Easter.

Sincerely repent of all our sins.

Place our complete trust in Jesus.

Go to confession, preferably before that Sunday.

Receive Holy Communion on the day of the Feast.

Venerate the Image of the Divine Mercy.

Be merciful to others, through our actions, words, and prayers on their behalf.

Our Lord's promise to grant complete forgiveness of sins and punishment on the Feast of Mercy is recorded three times in the Diary of St. Faustina.

I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy (1109).

"Whoever approaches the Fountain of Life on this day will be granted complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (300)

I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: "Jesus I Trust in You." (327) The graces of mercy are drawn by means of one vessel only, and that is - Trust. The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive (1578). I never reject a contrite heart (1485). Sooner would heaven and earth turn to nothingness than would My mercy not embrace a trusting soul (1777).

The first day of the Novena of the Divine Mercy starts on Good Friday.

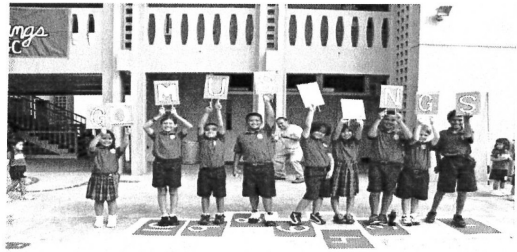
