Ministry Resource Update

Readers

Are the movements of the readers prayerful and reverent? In the absence of a deacon, does the reader process up with the Book of Gospels? Does the reader appear to be present to each member of the assembly? Is the reading directed not only to individuals, but to the assembly as a whole? Is the reading proclaimed in a sincere, personal manner? Is it apparent that the reader has prepared by praying with the reading? Do the readers use the Lectionary to do the readings? Is there a brief pause after the reading before "The Word of the Lord?" Is "The Word of the Lord" proclaimed with the same conviction as the reading? Does the reader invite reflection by his/her actions following the reading? When the readers are not proclaiming their reading, do they listen attentively to the other readings? Do they respond with the assembly in silence and psalm? Is it clear that they are members of the assembly during the other parts of the Mass?

Our focus today is often drawn toward doubting Thomas in the Gospel reading, but we may want to pay attention to some details from Jesus' first appearance the week before. After blessing them with peace, Jesus tells the disciples that they are sent just as the Father sent Jesus. Then He gives them the gift of the Holy Spirit and the power to forgive sins. Thomas comes later, but by professing his faith he too will receive these gifts. Will we, who come even later, receive these gifts and be sent like the first disciples? What is God telling you in these readings today?

Divine Mercy Sunday reminds us that the fight is over...God's mercy wins in the end. And our two newest saints help us believe this truth.

First, whether you view Vatican II as attempting to become more relevant for modern peoples or as returning to our historic roots, there is no doubt the Holy Spirit worked through Pope John XXII, though our Church Fathers at Vatican II and now through all of us who are living Vatican II into reality.

And Pope John Paul II? A human face to Jesus! As we celebrated last week, Jesus threw His arms wide open on the cross and cried out "I love you!" with His very life. And for over twenty years, John Paul II flew round the world and did the same thing as he rode his pope mobile and greeted the crowds. John Paul II reminds us that Jesus works through humans to make sure we know we are loved.

Saints John and John Paul, pray for us! Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

Divine Mercy Sunday Series V Proclaim The Great Mercy Of God

In the diary of St. Faustina, our Lord told her to let the people know about His mercy. Proclaim to the whole world My unfathomable mercy (1142). Proclaim that mercy is the greatest attribute of God. All the works of My hand are crowned with mercy (301). Souls who spread the honor of My mercy I shield through their entire life as a tender mother to her infant, and at the hour of death I will not be a Judge for them, but the Merciful Savior (1075). Do whatever is within your power to spread devotion to My mercy. I will make up for what you lack. Tell aching mankind to snuggle close to My merciful heart, and I will fill it with peace (1074). Encourage souls to say the Chaplet which I have given you (541). Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death (687). When they say this Chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the Judge but as a Merciful Savior (1541). At the hour of their death, I defend as My own glory every soul that will say this Chaplet, or when others say it for a dying person, the pardon is the same (811).
