I can imagine the disciples' feeling of inadequacy in today's Gospel as they brought forth their paltry offering of five fish and two loaves of bread. This was not enough to feed themselves, let alone the entire crowd!

Yet, Jesus asked what they had. So they gave it to him.

We do the same thing at every offertory at every Mass. The collection of our money and a family bringing up the bread and wine is like the disciples showing Jesus their fish. It is so little. We really offer Jesus so little.

Jesus accepts our gifts too. And then Jesus turns the little we have into nourishment for the entire community - giving us more than we need for the fullness of life.

Ironically this is not the end of the story. Did you know that each Sunday we are asked to place our lives on the altar? All the good and bad, the blessings and heartbreaks of our past week. I invite you to do this more intentionally - give Jesus the (paltry) offering of your past week. Jesus will then turn our very life into nourishment for all.

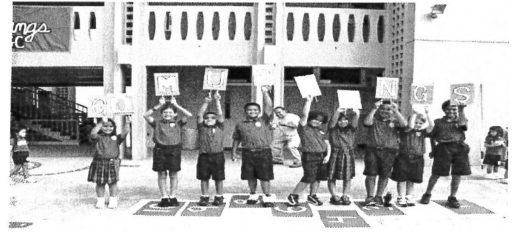
